# **Annual Meeting Report**


### 1. 2018 Annual Meeting Overview


At our first AADR meeting in Florida this Spring, ORG received 80 abstracts and for the IADR meeting in London this Summer we received 158 abstracts. This incredible response from orthodontists, other specialists and researchers from different countries resulted in lively and engaging scientific sessions.

### 2. Knowledge Gaps & Proposed Initiatives



Our second business meeting/reception was very well attended and facilitated a great and productive discussion. As a result, we are announcing here some of the proposed initiatives that came out of the business meeting.

#### Animal models for tooth movement

At the IADR meeting, Dr. Maria Cadenas de Llano Pérula presented the results of a systematic review on the animal studies of tooth movement, which revealed a frightening reality: Published studies vary immensely in terms of the animal model used (from primates and dogs to all kind of rodents), force used to move teeth (from 5 gram to 4 kilograms), time points the data were collected (from hours to days to weeks to months). This tremendous variation prevents our efforts to draw well-supported conclusions and hurts the understanding on the topic. Therefore, is was suggested that we create a task force to establish guidelines for animal tooth movement studies, so we can build a comparable body of evidence that can accelerate advancement of our specialty.

Dr. Maria Cadenas de Llano Pérula, Dr. Cristina Teixeira and Dr. Stella Chaushu accepted to be part of this task force and lead this effort.

#### **Soft Tissue Research Studies**

This is an area where our understanding is lacking. What is the role of muscles including tongue, and their altered function on the etiology of malocclusions, how these can be treated and what is their contribution to relapse? Some colleagues suggested that we facilitate collaborations and try connecting colleagues in ORG already developing work within this research area.

#### **Finite Element Analysis**

Among ORG members are colleagues with expertise in FEA. This is another area of possible collaborations. Dr. Babak Sarrafpour volunteered to help colleagues develop FEA models for their projects.

## 3. Awards and Recognitions

One of the missions of ORG is to nurture a new generation of clinician/scientists who can support innovation in Orthodontics and continue to move our specialty forward. One opportunity to support our young members is through awards that can help offset the cost of attending an AADR/IADR. meeting while recognizing excellence in Orthodontics.

In 2018, ORG receive 3 donations that allow the creation of 3 awards:

- CTOR Award for Student Excellence in Orthodontics Research
- INNOVATION Award for Excellence in Orthodontics Research
